A Better Way to Refill

- ① Our school should install a water-bottle filling station near the gym. After running at recess or practicing in PE, students often wait in line for the single fountain. A filling station would let students refill bottles quickly. It could also reduce the number of plastic bottles tossed into trash cans. Clean, easy-to-find water would help students stay ready to learn.
- ② Some people may worry that the station would cost too much. However, the school could seek a small grant or ask the parent group to help raise money. Many filling stations include a counter that shows how many disposable bottles have been saved. That feature could help students see how daily choices affect the school grounds and the wider community.
- ③ A water-bottle filling station is a practical change that would serve students every day. It would shorten fountain lines, make refilling easier, and cut plastic waste. For these reasons, adding a station near the gym would be a smart choice for our school. It would show that our school cares about students' health and the places we share.
