Maya Researches Monarchs

- ① Maya wanted to answer the question, “Why do monarch butterflies need milkweed?” She began with a book from her school library, *Monarchs and Milkweed* by Anurag Agrawal. In her notes, she wrote, “Monarch caterpillars eat milkweed leaves.” She also wrote the page number, 18, so she could find the fact again. The detail helped answer her question, so it belonged in her notes.
- ② Next, Maya used a digital source from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service called “Monarch Butterfly.” The webpage explained that adult monarchs drink nectar from many kinds of flowers. Maya did not copy the sentence. Her note said, “Adult monarchs get food from flower nectar.” She recorded the organization and webpage title. This source gave useful information, but it did not explain why caterpillars need milkweed.
- ③ During a visit to a community garden, Maya saw bees moving between flowers, but she did not use that observation as proof about monarch caterpillars. Instead, she used it as a separate idea about pollinators. In her finished paragraph, Maya explained that monarch caterpillars rely on milkweed leaves for food. At the end, she listed both sources: Agrawal’s book and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service webpage.
