The Light on Seguin Island

- ① On a rocky island off the coast of Maine, the crew at Seguin Island Light once depended on a huge lens to send a beam far over the ocean. In 1857, workers installed a Fresnel lens made of many glass prisms. The prisms bent and focused lamplight into a strong beam. Sailors could spot the light from much farther away than an ordinary lamp.
- ② Keeping the lens bright took daily work. A keeper had to carry fuel up the tower, light the lamp at sunset, and clean soot from the glass. Even a small amount of dirt could weaken the beam. During storms, keepers also listened for fog signals and watched the water. Their careful work helped ships avoid dangerous rocks near the island.
- ③ Today, Seguin Island Light is no longer staffed by keepers every night. Volunteers and preservation groups work to protect the lighthouse and its history. The original lens is displayed at the Maine Maritime Museum, while a modern light shines from the tower. These changes show that the lighthouse still serves two purposes: it aids navigation and teaches visitors about the past.

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)

Seguin Island Light made ocean travel safer because it combined a powerful lens with daily care. Its glass prisms focused lamplight into a beam sailors could see farther away, helping them notice the light. Keepers cleaned soot from the glass, which kept dirt from weakening the beam.
