A Better Place to Refill

- ① Riverside Middle School should install a water-bottle filling station near the cafeteria. Many students carry reusable bottles, so they need a quick place to refill them during the day. Although drinking fountains provide water, they can be hard to use with tall bottles. A filling station would solve that problem because its spout is designed to fill containers. Therefore, students could choose tap water instead of buying bottled drinks. This change would support everyday healthy habits.
- ② First, a filling station could reduce single-use plastic waste. When students can refill bottles easily, fewer may buy disposable bottles at lunch or after sports practice. As a result, less plastic may enter trash cans, where it must be collected and managed. The station would not erase all plastic waste; however, it would give students a practical choice each day. Since repeated choices add up over a school year, this small change could make the cafeteria area cleaner.
- ③ Second, the station could save time. During a short lunch period, students sometimes wait to drink from a fountain or search for a place to refill a bottle. If a station stood near the cafeteria, they could refill bottles while walking to their tables. Consequently, they would have more time to eat and talk with friends. Some people may worry about the cost. Yet the school should consider the station because it would serve many students for years.

1	What is the writer's claim?	Riverside Middle School should install a water-bottle filling station near the cafeteria.
2	In paragraph 1, what relationship does the word "Therefore" show?	It shows a result: because the station would make refilling easier, students could choose tap water instead of buying bottled drinks.
3	How does the clause beginning with "Since repeated choices" in paragraph 2 support the writer's claim?	It explains that students' daily choices to refill bottles could add up over the school year and make the cafeteria area cleaner.
4	How do "however" in paragraph 2 and "Yet" in paragraph 3 clarify the writer's reasoning?	"However" contrasts the station's limits with its practical benefit, and "Yet" contrasts the cost concern with the reason the school should still consider the station.
