Later Starts for Middle School

- ① Middle schools should begin classes later in the morning. Many students arrive before they have had enough sleep, especially when buses pick them up early. Sleep helps people focus, remember information, and manage moods. A later start would not solve every problem students face, but it could give more students a better chance to arrive alert. Schools could adjust bus routes, activity times, or other parts of the schedule to make this change possible for families.
- ② Research supports this idea. The American Academy of Pediatrics has said that middle and high schools should aim for start times of 8:30 a.m. or later so teenagers can get enough sleep. In one study of Seattle students, moving high school start times later was linked to longer sleep and better grades. Although each district must consider transportation and family schedules, these findings show that a later start can support learning, not simply make mornings more comfortable.
- ③ For these reasons, middle schools should move their start times later when they can do so safely and fairly. Students need sleep to learn well, and research connects later starts with more sleep and improved school performance. District leaders should study their transportation plans and ask families for input before making a change. A thoughtful later schedule would put students' readiness to learn at the center of each school day for every student who attends.
