From River to Tap

- ① Before water reaches city taps, it travels through a treatment plant. First, workers add coagulants, chemicals that cause tiny particles of dirt and other material to clump together. In a mixing basin, these clumps grow into heavier pieces called floc. The floc settles to the bottom of a sedimentation tank, while clearer water moves onward. This step removes many suspended solids, but it does not remove every germ or dissolved substance still present in the water.
- ② Next, the water passes through filters made of layers such as sand, gravel, and anthracite coal. The filter media trap smaller particles that escaped sedimentation. Plant operators then disinfect the water, often with chlorine or chloramine, to inactivate harmful microorganisms. They test samples for turbidity, a measure of cloudiness, and for disinfectant levels. These measurements help operators decide whether the water meets safety requirements before it enters storage tanks and distribution pipes that serve nearby homes.
- ③ Clean water must remain protected after treatment. Storage tanks hold treated water until pumps send it through a distribution system. Pressure in the pipes helps move water to homes, schools, and businesses. Utility crews inspect pipes for leaks because a broken main can waste treated water and allow contaminants to enter. In some systems, operators maintain a small disinfectant residual so the water stays protected as it travels. Residents can report discolored water or a sudden loss of pressure to the utility.

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)

At a treatment plant, coagulants form floc, which settles in a sedimentation tank, and filters trap smaller particles. Operators disinfect the water with chlorine or chloramine to inactivate harmful microorganisms and test turbidity and disinfectant levels. Pumps send the treated water through a distribution system, where a disinfectant residual helps protect it as it travels.
