More Places to Refill

- ① Our school should add two water-refill stations near the gym and cafeteria. Many students carry reusable bottles, but the existing fountains are often crowded between classes. A refill station fills bottles quickly, so students could get water without being late. It would also make choosing water easier during sports and after lunch. By providing reliable places to refill bottles, the school could help students stay hydrated throughout the day. This change would serve students who do not have time to visit a distant fountain.
- ② Refill stations could also reduce waste. Students sometimes buy single-use plastic bottles when fountains are busy or unavailable. According to the Environmental Protection Agency, many plastic bottles and jars can be recycled, yet recycling does not eliminate the energy and materials used to make new bottles. When students refill durable bottles, fewer disposable containers are needed. The school could place clear signs by each station and ask the student council to share bottle-refill habits. These practical steps would support both cleaner campus spaces and wiser use of resources.
- ③ Adding refill stations is a sensible improvement the school can make now. They would give students faster access to water, especially during busy parts of the day, and they would reduce the need for disposable bottles. The stations would also show that the school values students' health and responsible use of materials. Because this plan solves a daily problem while supporting a cleaner campus, the principal should include refill stations in the next facilities budget.
