A Prop With a Past

- ① On Saturday morning, Lena unlocked the school theater's storage room and switched on the dusty lights. First, she searched the shelves for the blue lantern needed in that night's play. Behind a stack of cardboard moons, she found a box labeled "River Set, 2018." As she lifted the lid, a painted wooden boat slid into view. For a moment, the quiet room smelled like old paint and raincoats. Then Lena noticed a note tucked beneath the boat's broken oar.
- ② The note sent Lena back to 2018, when she had watched her older brother perform in *The River Thief*. At that time, the boat had glided across the stage while a fan made its paper waves tremble. During the final scene, her brother had knelt beside it and sung a farewell song. Now, in the storage room, Lena read the note again. It said that the boat's makers had hidden a spare lantern inside its hull. Carefully, she turned the boat over and opened a small panel.
- ③ Inside, wrapped in silver paper, lay the missing lantern. A minute later, Lena carried it upstairs to the bright stage, where students were taping painted clouds to the wall. Meanwhile, the director tested the sound system in the auditorium. Before the audience arrived, Lena placed the lantern beside the boat and repaired the oar with tape. Finally, as the curtain rose that evening, the boat crossed the stage again. From the back row, Lena's brother, now home from college, recognized the old prop and waved.
