SUPPORTING CLAIM

A supporting claim agrees with the writer's position. It gives a reason the position makes sense.

COUNTERCLAIM

A counterclaim presents a different or opposing view. It gives the writer an idea to acknowledge and answer.

PART 3 • MAKE YOUR OWN (SAMPLE ANSWERS)

- **SUPPORTS:** Protected bike lanes can help people travel to school or work without driving.
- **COUNTER:** Construction could disrupt traffic while streets are redesigned.

Challenge: The city should build protected bike lanes on major streets because separated space can reduce conflicts between bicycles and cars. Although some residents worry about losing parking, the city can preserve loading zones where businesses need them.
