Start School Later

- ① At 7:20 a.m., many high school students are still fighting their body clocks. The American Academy of Pediatrics has recommended that middle and high schools begin at 8:30 a.m. or later because adolescent sleep cycles shift later during puberty. Our district should move its high school start time to 8:45. A later bell would not erase homework or busy schedules, but it would give students a better chance to arrive alert, learn effectively, and drive more safely. This change would address a real barrier to learning rather than asking tired teenagers to simply try harder.
- ② Sleep is not merely a comfort issue. Teenagers generally need eight to ten hours of sleep each night, yet early schedules can make that goal difficult, especially when buses arrive before sunrise. Research summarized by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention links insufficient sleep in adolescents with poorer attention, lower academic performance, and increased risk-taking. A later start would also help families: students who are more awake may be less likely to rush through breakfast, miss the bus, or struggle to focus during first period. These benefits make schedule planning an educational and safety concern.
- ③ Some people worry that changing the bell schedule would disrupt sports, jobs, and elementary bus routes. Those concerns deserve planning, not dismissal. The district could adjust practice times, coordinate bus routes in stages, and survey families about transportation needs before making the change. Schools in many communities already manage different schedules for different grade levels. Because a later start responds to adolescent sleep needs, strengthens students' readiness to learn, and can be planned carefully around community needs, the district should adopt an 8:45 high school start time next year. Delaying this decision keeps a preventable obstacle in place for students every morning.
