A Later Bell for Riverton

- ① Riverton High School should begin classes at 8:30 a.m. rather than 7:45. The American Academy of Pediatrics has recommended that middle and high schools start at 8:30 or later because adolescents' sleep cycles shift later during puberty. A later bell would not simply offer students extra comfort. It would give many students a better chance to get the eight to ten hours of sleep that teenagers generally need. When students arrive rested, they are more prepared to listen, solve problems, and participate in class.
- ② Changing the schedule would require planning, especially for buses, sports, and families' work routines. However, districts that consider a later start can study transportation routes and ask families about local needs before making a decision. Riverton could also protect after-school activities by adjusting practice times or using study periods more efficiently. These steps do not erase every challenge, but they show that the schedule is a problem to manage, not a reason to ignore students' health. A careful transition plan would make the policy more practical.
- ③ Riverton should therefore adopt an 8:30 start time and phase it in with a transportation and activities plan. The evidence about adolescent sleep shows why the change matters for learning, while the planning steps show how the school can address reasonable concerns. Keeping the earlier schedule may seem easier in the short term, but convenience should not outweigh students' ability to arrive ready to learn. By choosing a later start and preparing for its effects, the school can make a practical decision that puts student health and classroom learning first.

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)

Creating a supervised quiet lunch space is a sensible use of the school's available resources. Because a less crowded setting can help students who need calm during lunch, and an unused conference room can serve that purpose, the plan addresses both student needs and practicality. The school should make this small change so more students can return to afternoon classes ready to focus.

Accept conclusions that clearly recommend the quiet lunch space, synthesize both the student-need and available-room reasons, and end with a logical implication. Responses must contain exactly three sentences and 55 to 70 words.
