Proposal for a Refill Station

- ① To the Facilities Committee, I respectfully request that the school install a water bottle refill station near the gymnasium. During physical education classes and after-school practices, many students use the nearby fountain, which has a low spout and often creates a line. A refill station would allow students to fill reusable bottles quickly. This improvement could reduce the number of disposable plastic bottles used on campus and help students return to class or practice without unnecessary delay.
- ② The proposed location is practical because the gymnasium hallway is used by athletes, health classes, and students walking to the cafeteria. Installing the station there would serve several groups without requiring major changes to classrooms. The school should ask the maintenance staff to examine the plumbing before selecting a model. Their review would identify whether the existing water line can support the equipment and would provide a reasonable estimate of installation costs for the project.
- ③ Although the station would require an initial purchase, its benefits justify careful consideration. Students who carry reusable bottles would have a convenient way to get water during active periods. In addition, fewer purchases of single-use bottles could lessen waste in outdoor trash bins. I recommend that the committee review the maintenance report, compare two suitable station models, and include student representatives in the discussion. This process would support an informed decision that considers cost, safety, and daily use.
