A Refill Station Near the Gym

- ① Riverview Middle School should install a water-bottle refill station near the gym. Students leave practices thirsty, and the nearest fountain is down a long hallway. A refill station would let students fill reusable bottles quickly with cold, filtered water. It could also show how many plastic bottles have been avoided, making the school's waste-reduction goal visible. Adding one station is a practical change that could improve daily routines for athletes, coaches, and other students who use the gym.
- ② Some people may worry that a refill station would cost too much or create a line between classes. However, the school can place it by the gym, where students already wait for rides or practices. Reusable bottles can be filled in seconds, unlike a trip to a distant fountain. The station would not solve every waste problem, but it would give students an easy choice each day. Small habits matter when many students carry drinks during sports, clubs, and field days.
- ③ For these reasons, Riverview should add a refill station near the gym. It would give active students faster access to water and make reusable bottles a more convenient option. Although the station would require planning and money, its daily benefits would reach many students throughout the year. A single station cannot remove all plastic waste, yet it is a sensible first step toward a healthier, less wasteful school routine for everyone who uses the building.

For these reasons, the library should stay open for 30 minutes after school. It would give students a quiet place to finish work and a safe space to wait for late buses. Although an adult would need to supervise, the extra time would serve students who need it most.
