HUNDREDS, TENS, ONES

In a 3-digit number, the digits show hundreds, tens, and ones. Read from left to right: hundreds, tens, ones. A digit's value depends on its place.

WORKED EXAMPLE

A craft box has 472 beads.
What is the value of the 7?

1. 472 has 4 hundreds, 7 tens, and 2 ones.
2. The 7 is in the tens place.
3. 7 tens = 70.

Answer: 70

PART 2 • APPLY IT

1. **Sam has more tickets. Both numbers have 6 hundreds, but 643 has 4 tens and 634 has 3 tens.** Compare the hundreds first. The hundreds are equal, so compare the tens: 4 tens is greater than 3 tens.
2. **200 visitors** The 2 is in the hundreds place. It means 2 hundreds, or 200.

CHALLENGE

No. The 4 is in the hundreds place, so it means 400. The number has 4 hundreds, 0 tens, and 7 ones.

Accept "5 hundreds" or "500" for problem 2. For expanded form, accept $400 + 60 + 9$ only, with addends in any order.
