ROUND BY LOOKING RIGHT

Find the digit in the place you are rounding to. Look at the digit directly to its right. If it is 5 or more, increase the rounding digit by 1. If it is 4 or less, keep the rounding digit the same, then change all digits to the right to zeros.

WORKED EXAMPLE

Round 48,372 to the nearest hundred.

1. The hundreds digit is 3.
2. The tens digit is 7, so increase the hundreds digit by 1.
3. Change the tens and ones digits to zeros: 48,400.

Answer: 48,400

PART 2 • APPLY IT

1. **19,000 players** The thousands digit is 8. The hundreds digit is 7, so round up to 19,000.
2. **250,000 books** The ten thousands digit is 4. The thousands digit is 6, so round up to 250,000.

CHALLENGE

No. 572,650 rounds to 573,000 because the hundreds digit is 6, so the thousands digit rounds up from 2 to 3.

Accept answers with or without commas when the value is correct. For the challenge, accept explanations that state the hundreds digit is 6 or is 5 or more, so the thousands digit increases.
