PLAN YOUR STEPS

Read the problem and decide which operation matches each part. Solve one step at a time, and check whether your answer makes sense for the question.

WORKED EXAMPLE

A museum has 13 display cases with 22 fossils in each case. Then 41 fossils are moved to a research room. How many fossils remain on display?

1. Find the fossils at first: $13 \times 22 = 286$.
2. Subtract the fossils moved away: $286 - 41 = 245$.

Answer: 245 fossils

2. **20 beads** Multiply 6×35 to get 210 beads, then subtract 30 to get 180. Divide 180 by 9 to get 20 beads per group.
