FACTORS CHANGE SIZE

When you multiply a positive number by a fraction greater than 1, the product is greater than the number you started with. When you multiply by a fraction less than 1, the product is smaller. A fraction like n/n equals 1, so multiplying by it makes an equivalent fraction.

WORKED EXAMPLE

Write an equivalent fraction for $19/23$ by multiplying by $14/14$.

- $14/14 = 1$.
- $19/23 \times 14/14 = (19 \times 14)/(23 \times 14)$.
- $(19 \times 14)/(23 \times 14) = 266/322$.

Answer: 266/322, which is equal to 19/23

PART 2 • APPLY IT

- 15 badges. The factor $\frac{3}{2}$ is greater than 1, so the product is greater than 10.** Multiply $10 \times \frac{3}{2}$ to get 15. Since $\frac{3}{2}$ is greater than 1, the badge total increases.
- 12 minutes. The factor $\frac{2}{3}$ is less than 1, so the product is smaller than 18.** Multiply $18 \times \frac{2}{3}$ to get 12. Since $\frac{2}{3}$ is less than 1, the trailer is shorter.

CHALLENGE

$\frac{7}{12} \times \frac{3}{4} < \frac{7}{12} \times 1 < \frac{7}{12} \times \frac{5}{4}$. Multiplying by $\frac{3}{4}$, a fraction less than 1, makes the product smaller, while multiplying by $\frac{5}{4}$, a fraction greater than 1, makes the product greater.

Accept correct comparison words or symbols and explanations that name whether the factor is greater than or less than 1. For problems that request a specific denominator, require that denominator.
