Use positive, negative, and zero in real situations.

POSITIVE, NEGATIVE, ZERO

Use a positive number for a quantity above, added, or in the chosen positive direction. Use a negative number for a quantity below, lost, or in the opposite direction. Zero means there is no amount or change from the reference point.

WORKED EXAMPLE

A drone is 72 meters above a field.
Positions above the field are
positive. Write the drone's position.

1. Above the field is the positive direction.
2. Write 72 with a plus sign: +72.

Answer: +72 meters

CHALLENGE

An ocean research team records positions relative to sea level: buoy A is +4 meters, buoy B is -4 meters, and buoy C is 0 meters. Which two buoys are the same distance from sea level but in opposite directions? What does buoy C's 0 mean?

PART 2 • APPLY IT

1. **-12 meters; 0 means Malik is at the entrance.** West is the opposite of the positive east direction, so the position is -12 meters. A position of 0 is the reference point, the entrance.
2. **+11 points and -11 points; 0 means no change in ranking points.** Earning points is positive, so write +11. Losing points is negative, so write -11; 0 means the score did not change.

CHALLENGE

Buoys A and B; buoy C is at sea level.

Accept a positive value written without a plus sign when the context clearly shows it is positive. Accept equivalent wording for zero, such as "at the reference point" or "no change."
