CHANGE THE UNIT

To change from a larger unit to a smaller unit, multiply by the number of smaller units in one larger unit. To change from a smaller unit to a larger unit, divide by that same number and label your answer with the new unit.

WORKED EXAMPLE

Convert 5 weeks to days.

- 1 week = 7 days.
- 5 weeks $\times$ 7 days per week = 35 days.
- The weeks cancel, so days is the unit left.

Answer: 35 days

A refill station has 3.2 liters of water. It fills 8 equal bottles. How many milliliters of water go in each bottle?

PART 2 • APPLY IT

- 3,960 feet** Multiply 5,280 feet per mile by $\frac{3}{4}$ mile. $5,280 \times \frac{3}{4} = 3,960$.
- 3 minutes** First multiply $4 \times 45 = 180$ seconds. Then divide 180 by 60 seconds per minute to get 3 minutes.
