HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Read each prompt aloud, then repeat it as needed. Students listen for words that ask, tell, or show a strong feeling and connect them to the correct end mark.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • CIRCLE IT

SAY “Each row has three end marks. I will read a sentence and name the marks. Listen to what the sentence does, then circle the mark it needs at the end.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	The marks are period, question mark, and exclamation mark. Listen: “Can you hop?” Which end mark belongs at the end of my question?	?
b	The marks are question mark, period, and exclamation mark. Listen: “Watch out for the wet paint!” Which end mark belongs after these strong words?	!
c	The marks are period, exclamation mark, and question mark. Listen: “I see a red bus.” Which end mark belongs at the end of my telling sentence?	.

PART 2 • MATCH MARKS

SAY “Look at the words on the left and the end marks on the right. I will read each word and each mark. Draw a line from each word to the mark it needs at the end.”

- **ASK** matches ?
- **TELL** matches .
- **WOW** matches !

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Circle row answers are question mark, exclamation mark, then period. Match ASK to ?, TELL to ., and WOW to !; accept clear circles and lines.
