Eli's Bean Seed Writing

- ① On Monday, Eli wrote a first draft about planting bean seeds. He planned by making a list: cup, soil, seed, and water. Then he wrote three sentences. His draft said, “I put a seed in dirt. It grow fast. I like my plant.”
- ② His partner, Rosa, read the draft. She said, “Tell where you planted the seed.” Rosa also noticed that grow needed an ending. Mr. Chen helped Eli check capital letters and end marks. Eli listened to both helpers.
- ③ Next, Eli revised his writing by adding that the seed went into a cup of soil. He edited the sentence to say, “It grows fast.” His final piece had clearer details, correct capitals, and end marks.
