Maya Talks About Bees

- ① On Friday, Maya gives a short talk about bees. She stands facing her class and holds her picture where everyone can see it. In a clear, medium voice, she says, "Bees visit flowers to collect nectar and pollen."
- ② Maya points to the yellow pollen on her picture. She says each word carefully, especially nectar and pollen. Then she asks, "How do bees help flowers?" Maya pauses quietly. Two classmates raise their hands to share ideas.
- ③ To finish, Maya says, "Bees carry pollen from flower to flower. This helps many plants make seeds." She looks at her classmates and says, "Thank you for listening." Her voice is loud enough for the back table.
