Mina Researches Bees

- ① Mina wanted to learn why bees visit flowers. She wrote a question in her notebook:
How do bees help flowers? First, Mina read a library book about bees. She looked for facts that answered her question, not every fact on the page.
- ② The book said that bees drink nectar from flowers. Yellow dust, called pollen, can stick to a bee's body. Mina wrote this note: Bees can carry pollen from one flower to another.
- ③ Next, Mina watched a short video from a nature museum. It showed a bee moving between flowers. Mina added a second note: When pollen reaches another flower, it can help the flower make seeds. Her two notes answered her question.
