A Garden Invitation

- ① Ms. Lee's class made a poster to invite families to the school garden. Their written message told the day, time, and place. Then Maya added a bright photo of a sunflower with a bee on it.
- ② The photo helped people see what grows in the garden. Jordan drew a simple map from the front gate to the garden beds. The map helped visitors find the event without asking for directions.
- ③ At the event, Nia read the poster words aloud. She pointed to the photo and map as she spoke. The class chose each picture because it gave useful information that words alone could not show as quickly.
