A Water Tip Online

- ① Mia and Theo wanted to share a tip about saving water. Their teacher opened a class writing app and helped them sign in. Mia typed a title, "Turn Off the Tap." Theo typed a short sentence under it.
- ② Next, they read the words on the screen together. Theo noticed that water was spelled wrong. He fixed it. Mia added a drawing of a faucet. They asked their teacher to help them choose the class page.
- ③ Their teacher checked the page before it was shared. Then Mia and Theo pressed the publish button together. Other children could read their water tip on the class page. Mia and Theo read two kind comments from classmates.
