Two Texts About Monarchs

- ① Text 1: Maya watched a monarch butterfly rest on a milkweed leaf. Its orange wings, lined in black, opened and closed. "Are you going far?" she whispered. The butterfly lifted into the bright sky. Maya imagined it flying south when cold weather came.
- ② Text 2: Monarch butterflies have orange wings with black lines. In fall, many monarchs fly south to warmer places. This trip is called migration. They do not all travel alone. Large groups may rest together in trees during their long journey.
- ③ Monarch caterpillars eat milkweed leaves. Adult monarchs drink nectar from flowers. Milkweed gives caterpillars food, and it is a place for female monarchs to lay eggs. People can help monarchs by planting milkweed and nectar flowers.

2	How do the texts tell about monarchs going south in different ways?	Text 1 shows Maya imagining one monarch flying south when cold weather comes. Text 2 explains that many monarchs migrate south in fall to warmer places.
3	What is one way Text 2 gives more information than Text 1?	Text 2 gives facts about monarch food, eggs, migration, or groups resting in trees, while Text 1 does not.
