- ② Near the tomato plants, Mina saw a puddle of water. The soil was soggy, or very wet, from the morning rain. She stepped carefully so her boots would not sink into the mud.
- ③ A busy bee moved from flower to flower. It gathered nectar, a sweet liquid inside flowers, to help make honey. Mina watched the bee carry yellow dust, called pollen, on its fuzzy legs.
