Inside a Beehive

- ① On a warm day, honey bees visit flowers near their hive. A bee uses its long tongue to sip nectar, a sweet liquid inside some flowers. Then it flies home with tiny drops of nectar in a special pouch.
- ② Inside the hive, workers are busy bees that do jobs. Some workers fan their wings to cool the hive. Other workers guard the entrance. The hive can be crowded, or full of many bees in one small place.
- ③ A worker may perform a waggle dance to show other bees where food is. Perform means do or carry out. During this dance, the bee moves in a wiggling path, then turns and repeats the path.
