The Tree Grate Question

- ① Maya wanted to find out why some city trees have metal grates around their trunks. She wrote her question in a notebook: How do tree grates help street trees? First, she read a library book about city parks. The book explained that grates cover soil while leaving space for rain and air to reach tree roots.
- ② Next, Maya used a city forestry webpage. It said that a grate can protect loose soil near a busy sidewalk. Maya also interviewed Mr. Chen, a park worker. He told her that grates can help people notice a tree opening and avoid stepping on its roots. She copied only useful facts and wrote each source beside its information.
- ③ To organize her research, Maya made three labeled boxes in her notebook: Book, Webpage, and Interview. In the Book box, she wrote about rain and air reaching roots. In the Webpage box, she wrote about protecting soil. In the Interview box, she wrote about people avoiding roots. Her notes helped her answer the question using information from more than one source.
