A Garden Question

- ① Mila wanted to learn why monarch butterflies visit some gardens. She wrote a research question: "What do monarch butterflies need in a garden?" First, she read a library book about butterflies. On a note card, she wrote that adult monarchs drink nectar from flowers. The book also said that monarch caterpillars eat milkweed leaves, not flower nectar.
- ② Next, Mila used a website from a nature museum. It explained that monarchs lay eggs on milkweed plants. The caterpillars hatch and eat the milkweed. Mila checked both sources. Since each source mentioned milkweed, she put a star by that idea. She did not copy every sentence. Instead, she wrote short notes in her own words.
- ③ Finally, Mila looked at a city garden center's plant guide. It listed milkweed as a plant for monarch caterpillars and nectar flowers as food for adult butterflies. Her notes helped her answer her question: A monarch garden needs milkweed and nectar flowers. Mila listed the title of each source so she could find the information again.
