The Pumpkin Fence

- ① Maya hurried to the community garden after school. Her class was growing pumpkins for the fall fair, and today they needed to build a small fence. Maya saw wooden stakes, a spool of string, and a hammer beside the garden bed. “I can finish this before anyone else arrives,” she said. She picked up the hammer and began pounding a stake.
- ② The stake leaned sideways. Maya hit it again, but it sank at an angle and knocked over two young bean plants. Her face grew hot. Mr. Ortiz, the garden helper, walked over with Jordan and Lila. Maya wanted to hide her mistake. Then she remembered that the fence had to protect everyone's pumpkins, not prove what she could do alone.
- ③ “Could you show me how to make it straight?” Maya asked. Mr. Ortiz showed the three children how to pull the string tight between two stakes. Jordan held the string, Lila checked the space, and Maya tapped each stake carefully. Soon, the fence stood strong around the pumpkin patch. Maya smiled when the others thanked her for asking them to help.

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)

Devin tried to carry all the library books at once, even when his friend Nia offered a bag. The books slipped, and he had to pick them up from the floor. Devin accepted the bag, and they carried the books together. They returned every book before the library closed. Theme: Accepting help can make a hard job easier, shown when Devin drops the books and then shares the load with Nia.
