Life on a Coral Reef

- ① A coral reef is a busy ocean home. Tiny coral animals build hard homes near the surface. Colorful fish hide among the branches. Microscopic algae live inside many corals and help make food from sunlight. The algae are too small to see without a microscope, but they are important partners. Together, they support the reef community each day.
- ② A healthy reef has a protective shape. Its hard branches give small fish a place to rest and escape from hunters. During storms, reefs can reduce the force of waves before the waves reach shore. This protection can help beaches and homes near the coast. Reef animals depend on clean water to survive in it.
- ③ Sometimes water becomes unusually warm. When corals lose algae, they may turn pale. Scientists call this bleaching. A damaged reef can slowly rebuild if water conditions improve. People can help by reducing pollution, which keeps harmful materials out of the ocean. Pollution can make the water unhealthy for reef life and nearby sea animals, too.
