A Pine Cone Bird Feeder

- ① Today I will explain how to make a simple bird feeder from a pine cone. [Stand tall and look at listeners.] First, place a pine cone on a sheet of paper. Use a plastic spoon to spread sunflower-seed butter into the open spaces. Speak slowly and clearly when you say “pine cone,” so listeners can understand the two words.
- ② Next, sprinkle birdseed over the butter. [Point to the birdseed as you name it.] Press the seeds gently with the back of the spoon, so they stick. Then tie one end of a string around the top of the pine cone. Hold up the string for a moment. Use a medium volume for these directions, loud enough for everyone nearby to hear.
- ③ Last, hang the feeder from a tree branch with an adult's help. [Gesture upward when you say “tree branch.”] Step back and watch quietly. Birds may need time to find the feeder, especially if the spot is new. Finish by facing your listeners and saying, “Now you know the steps.” Pause after the final sentence so the ending sounds complete.

[Point to the circle] Say "circle" slowly and clearly. Last, draw short lines around the circle for rays. Use a louder volume to say, "The sun is finished."
