Maya's Garden Plan

- ① At the school garden meeting, Maya stood beside a poster that showed a plan for a butterfly garden. She looked at the families and said, "Our class wants to turn the empty corner near the fence into a place for butterflies." Her voice was clear enough for people at the back. She pointed to the poster only when she named each garden area.
- ② Next, Maya explained the plan in three steps. "First, we will pull weeds. Then, we will add native flowers. Last, we will place a shallow dish of water away from the path." She paused after each step so listeners could picture the work. When she mentioned helpers, she opened her hands toward the group and smiled.
- ③ Before she finished, Maya asked, "Who could bring a small trowel or gloves next Saturday?" She waited quietly instead of talking over the answers. After several people raised their hands, she nodded and repeated the jobs they chose. "Thank you for helping," she said. Maya ended by looking around the room and saying, "Together, we can make a safe stop for butterflies."
