Bean Plant Notes

- ① After lunch, Mia carried a tray of bean cups to the classroom window. "Look, one seed has a tiny root!" Mia said. Eli leaned closer and smiled. The class had planted the seeds three days earlier. Their teacher asked them to observe the cups, record changes, and water the soil when it felt dry. Each group kept a chart.
- ② The next morning, Eli pointed to a pale stem. "Can we measure it with a ruler?" he asked. Mia found a ruler in the supply box. "Please write the height in centimeters," she said. Eli measured the stem carefully, then wrote 2 centimeters on the chart. The students noticed that the plant was growing toward the light.
- ③ On Friday, the class compared the plants in each cup. "My plant is four centimeters tall," Mia said. Eli checked his chart and replied, "Mine is three centimeters tall." The teacher said, "Our careful notes helped us see the change." The class decided to keep watching the plants next week. They wanted to learn how much the stems would grow.
