Maya Researches Beavers

- ① When Maya's class studied wetlands, Maya chose a question: How do beavers change a pond? She began with a book from the school library called Beavers. The book explained that beavers build dams from branches, mud, and stones. A dam slows moving water. Maya wrote this fact under the heading "What a dam does" in her notes.
- ② Next, Maya used a webpage from a state wildlife agency. It said that the deeper water behind a beaver dam can spread into nearby land and create a pond. The page also explained that ponds can provide homes for fish, frogs, and water birds. Maya placed these facts under a second heading, "Changes to the habitat."
- ③ Finally, Maya checked a National Park Service article about wetlands. The article described how wetlands can hold water and help reduce flooding. This source did not say that every beaver pond prevents floods, so Maya did not add that claim to her notes. By using more than one reliable source, Maya could organize facts that answered her question without guessing.
