Maya’s Monarch Talk

- ① At the library, Maya gave a short talk about monarch butterflies. Her first slide showed a large photo of an orange-and-black monarch on a purple flower. Above the photo, the title read, “Help Monarchs Find Food.” The photo filled most of the slide, so the audience looked at the butterfly before reading the smaller words. This opening made the main idea clear.
- ② Next, Maya placed a simple map beside two short labels: “Mexico” and “Canada.” A bright arrow moved from Mexico to Canada, showing the monarchs’ migration path. She did not put the map at the beginning. After seeing the butterfly photo, listeners could use the map to understand where it travels. The arrow drew attention to the long trip.
- ③ For her last slide, Maya used a small bar graph below the words, “Plant milkweed.” The graph compared the number of monarchs seen in two school gardens, one with milkweed and one without it. She placed the action words at the top in bold print. The graph came after the request, giving listeners a reason to act. At the end, Maya repeated the photo from slide one.

#	QUESTION	ANSWER
1	Which multimedia element appears first, and why is it large?	A large photo of a monarch appears first. Its size makes the audience notice the butterfly and understand the main idea.
2	Why does Maya show the map after the butterfly photo instead of at the beginning?	After seeing the butterfly, listeners can use the map to understand where it travels.
3	Where does Maya place the words “Plant milkweed,” and what makes them stand out?	She places them at the top of the last slide in bold print.
4	What comes after Maya’s request to plant milkweed, and how does that order help her message?	A bar graph comes after the request. It gives listeners a reason to act.

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)

First, I would show a large photo of a dripping school faucet with the title “Every Drop Counts” above it. Next, I would place a simple bar graph comparing water used when a tap is on or off. Last, I would show the bold words “Turn It Off” beside a small water-drop icon so the audience remembers the action.

Accept answers that correctly identify the photo, map and arrow, bold action words, and bar graph, with their stated purposes. For the open task, accept any logical arrangement of at least three multimedia elements that clearly emphasizes saving water.
