A Garden Proposal

- ① On Monday, Maya opened a shared document to help her class write a proposal for a butterfly garden. First, she made a heading called “Plan.” Under it, she and Jordan used a bulleted list to collect ideas: a sunny spot, native flowers, and a water dish. They added comments beside ideas that needed facts. The list helped the partners choose what to explain in their proposal.
- ② Next, Jordan turned the list into a first draft in the same document. He wrote three short sections about the garden’s place, plants, and care. Maya used the comment tool to ask, “Which native flowers will grow here?” Jordan searched a trusted local park website and added two flower names. Because both students could see the document, they could work at different times without passing paper back and forth.
- ③ Before sharing the proposal, the partners revised it together. Maya used suggestion mode to change a repeated word, and Jordan accepted the change after reading it. Then they checked the heading, spelling, and facts. They moved the care section before the plant list so readers would understand who would water the garden. Last, they used the document’s share button to send the finished proposal to their teacher.
