Her teacher explained that monarchs use milkweed plants. The plants give monarch caterpillars the food they need to grow. Maya wrote the new fact in her notebook.
- ③ Later, a breeze shook the tall flowers near the fence. Maya spotted three more monarchs above the garden. "I found them!" she called. She did not chase the butterflies because their wings are delicate. Instead, she sketched their colors, counted the flowers they visited, and shared her notes with the class. At lunch, Maya wondered, "Will they return tomorrow?"
