Why Are the Beans Pale?

- ① On Monday, Maya joined the school garden team to investigate why some bean plants were growing slowly. She observed that plants near the fence had pale leaves, while plants in the center looked green and strong. Maya recorded the amount of sunlight each group received. Her notes gave the team useful evidence to examine later.
- ② Next, the team compared the two areas. The fence blocked morning light for several hours, so the nearby plants received less light than the center plants. The students formed a hypothesis: limited sunlight was affecting leaf color and growth. To test this idea, they moved two potted bean plants into sunny spaces and kept two others by the fence.
- ③ After two weeks, the sunny plants had darker leaves and grew taller. The team concluded that bean plants need enough sunlight for healthy growth. They shared their results with the principal and proposed placing future garden beds away from the fence. Their clear explanation used observations, evidence, and a conclusion to support a practical decision.
