#	ITEM	CATEGORY	WHY
1	The puppy slept on the rug.	LITERAL	This states an action that can happen exactly as written.
2	My backpack weighs a ton.	FIGURATIVE	A backpack does not truly weigh a ton. The speaker means it feels very heavy.
3	The test was a piece of cake.	FIGURATIVE	A test is not food. This means the test was easy.
4	We planted seeds in the garden.	LITERAL	This is an action that can happen exactly as stated.
5	The stars danced across the sky.	FIGURATIVE	Stars cannot literally dance. The words describe how they seemed to move or sparkle.
6	The window rattled in the wind.	LITERAL	A window can make a rattling sound when wind blows.
7	Luis carried three books.	LITERAL	This gives a possible action and an exact number.
8	The soup smelled spicy.	LITERAL	Soup can have a spicy smell.

PART 3 • MAKE YOUR OWN (SAMPLE ANSWERS)

- **LITERAL:** A turtle crawls beside a pond.
- **FIGURATIVE:** Her smile is sunshine.
