Trees Cool City Spaces

- ① On a hot summer day, city sidewalks and parking lots can become much warmer than nearby parks. Dark pavement absorbs sunlight and releases heat slowly. This change affects the local environment, especially when few trees provide shade. Scientists observe these temperature differences by placing thermometers on several surfaces at the same time. Their measurements create useful evidence.
- ② Trees can reduce heat in two ways. Their leaves block some sunlight before it reaches the ground. Trees also move water from their roots to their leaves, where the water evaporates. Evaporation uses heat energy, so the air around a tree may feel cooler. This process can improve comfort for people walking or waiting outdoors.
- ③ Communities use this evidence when they plan new spaces. For example, a school might plant trees beside a sunny playground or add a shaded bus stop. These choices can have a positive impact because they lower surface temperatures and protect people from intense sunlight. A careful plan considers where shade is needed most and how trees will receive enough water.
