A Pollinator Garden Proposal

- ① First, I will explain why our school should plant a small pollinator garden near the sunny fence. Bees, butterflies, and other pollinators move pollen between flowers, helping many plants make seeds and fruit. [Pause and look at the audience.] Our garden could provide nectar and shelter while giving students a place to observe living things. I will speak clearly and use a medium volume so classmates in the back can hear every word without feeling shouted at.
- ② Next, I will describe the plan in order. First, a group will measure the space and choose native plants that fit the sunlight and soil. Then, we will ask an adult to help us prepare the ground and place the plants. [Point to the simple map.] After planting, students can add water, mulch, and plant labels. I will slow down when I say words such as “pollinator” and “native” so my audience can understand them.
- ③ Finally, I will explain how the garden can continue after the first planting day. Classes could take turns checking whether the soil is dry, pulling weeds, and recording which insects visit. [Hold up two fingers while naming the two main benefits.] I will keep my sentences short and pause between ideas, rather than rushing. At the end, I will ask for volunteers and thank the audience. This ending connects to the plan and gives listeners a clear next step.
