Green Roofs in Cities

- ① Cities contain many dark roofs that soak up sunlight and shed rain into gutters. A green roof replaces part of that bare surface with waterproof layers, soil, and hardy plants. Green roofs can help crowded cities manage heat and rainwater, but they need careful planning and care. Designers must choose plants that can survive wind, sun, and periods with little rain. A well-designed roof can safely serve both a building and the nearby city around it.
- ② During a storm, rain falls on the plants and soil instead of racing at once across a smooth roof. Some water is held in the soil or taken in by plant roots. The remaining water leaves more slowly, which can reduce pressure on city drains during heavy rainfall. Plants also shade the roof surface. On hot days, that shade and the water released by plants can lower the roof's temperature. A cooler roof may reduce the energy a building uses for air conditioning.
- ③ Green roofs are not a solution for every building. Wet soil and plants add weight, so engineers must check whether a roof can hold the system safely. Installation costs can be higher than those for a standard roof, and workers may need to remove weeds or replace dead plants. Still, cities such as Chicago and Toronto have encouraged green roofs because the benefits can continue for years. The best projects match the roof design, local weather, and building owner's ability to care for it.
