**YOUR JOB** Read each paragraph aloud twice. On your second reading, draw slashes between smooth word groups and underline two words in each paragraph that need stronger stress.

### Sojourner's First Tracks

- ① In 1997, a small rover named Sojourner rolled across Mars. It was about the size of a microwave oven, yet it sent valuable information to scientists on Earth. Sojourner traveled from the Pathfinder lander and examined rocks with its instruments. Its wheels moved slowly over dusty ground, while its camera showed a landscape of red soil and scattered stones. The rover proved that a robot could explore another planet for many days. Each image added to scientists' understanding of Mars.
- ② One image from Sojourner helped scientists notice rounded pebbles near the landing site. Rounded pebbles can form when flowing water rubs rocks together over time. This evidence did not mean water was flowing on Mars in 1997. Instead, it suggested that liquid water may have moved through the area long ago. That possibility changed how scientists studied Mars. They looked for more clues about the planet's ancient climate and landscape. The small rover had opened a much larger question.
- ③ Before Sojourner, the Pathfinder mission had already made history by landing safely on Mars. The lander unfolded panels, took pictures, and sent signals home. Sojourner then drove away from the lander, becoming the first rover to operate on Mars. Its trip was short by modern standards, but its work was important. Later rovers, including Spirit, Opportunity, Curiosity, and Perseverance, traveled farther and carried more tools. Still, Sojourner's first tracks showed what future explorers could accomplish on Mars.
