### An Invitation Goes Digital

- ① For the school library’s new book-talk podcast, Maya made a digital announcement for seventh graders. She opened a presentation app and chose a blank, one-slide layout. Her headline named the podcast, and a short caption told students where and when to listen. Maya added a microphone photo that she was allowed to use and wrote alt text describing the image. Before publishing, she checked that the title was large enough to read on a phone.
- ② Next, Maya asked two classmates to review the draft in the app’s comment tool. One reader said the listening time was missing, so Maya added “Thursdays at 3:15 p.m.” Another reader noticed that the caption did not mention headphones. Maya revised it to say that headphones were helpful but not required. She used the app’s preview feature to look for crowded text, then saved the final announcement with a clear file name: LibraryPodcast\_Invite for easy searching later.
- ③ To share the announcement, Maya posted a view-only link in the class learning platform and added a brief message for students. She did not post the file in a public space because the announcement included the school’s meeting time. Her teacher approved the post, and Maya checked that the link opened for a student account. After the first episode, Maya used a form linked in the platform to collect suggestions for future book-talk topics. The responses helped the podcast team plan its next episode.
