The Field Guide Team

- ① When the Riverwatch Club decided to create a digital field guide for visitors to Marshview Park, the members did not begin by writing alone. In a shared document, Lena added headings for birds, plants, and trail safety. Mateo inserted a table for facts that needed checking. Each member chose a section by typing initials beside it. The document showed everyone’s edits right away, so the group could see which parts still needed research without sending several versions by email.
- ② On Tuesday, Aisha used the comment feature to ask whether a photo caption named the correct heron. She attached a link to the park district’s bird list, and Jordan replied in the same comment thread after comparing the source with the caption. Later, the team met in a video call to settle a disagreement about trail rules. While they talked, Jordan shared his screen and revised one sentence. The others watched the change, suggested clearer wording, and agreed to keep the new version.
- ③ Before publishing, Mateo opened the document’s version history. He noticed that a useful sentence about staying on marked paths had disappeared during an edit, so he restored it and told the group in a comment. The team used a task board to track final jobs, including proofreading, checking links, and adding photo credits. After every task was marked complete, Lena exported the guide as a PDF and shared it with the park’s volunteer coordinator. Their tools helped them build one accurate guide together.

2	What did Aisha and Jordan do in the comment thread to check the photo caption?	Aisha attached a link to the park district's bird list, and Jordan compared that source with the caption before replying.
3	During the video call, what did screen sharing allow the team to do?	The team could watch Jordan revise a sentence, suggest clearer wording, and agree on the new version.
4	How did version history and the task board help the team finish the guide?	Version history let Mateo restore a deleted sentence, and the task board tracked final jobs such as proofreading, link checking, and photo credits.

PART 3 • YOUR TURN (SAMPLE ANSWER)

We will draft sections in a shared document, and each writer will add their name to the section they own. We will use comments to question unclear facts and a video call to choose the clearest wording. A task board will track proofreading and photo credits, then one editor will check version history, export the agreed-on guide as a PDF, and share the final file with our class.

Accept equivalent descriptions of the tools and their purposes when they match the passage. For the open response, accept any three-sentence plan that names at least three digital tools or features, gives a collaborative use for each, and includes a way to finalize and share one group version.
