HOW TO RUN THIS PAGE

Tell students that rhyming words sound alike at the end. Model with a different example, such as “The sheep takes a nap so deep.” Read each tiny poem aloud, then read the words in its row before students circle their choice.

Students never read directions on this sheet. Read each part's script aloud, then each prompt, giving think time before students mark.

PART 1 • HEAR RHYMES

SAY “Listen to each tiny poem. I will read the words in the row. Which word rhymes with the word I ask about? Circle it.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	Listen: “A goat rode in a boat.” Here are the words: boat, kite, sock. Which word rhymes with goat?	boat
b	Listen: “A snail left a trail.” Here are the words: moon, trail, fish. Which word rhymes with snail?	trail
c	Listen: “The bear sat in a chair.” Here are the words: star, cup, chair. Which word rhymes with bear?	chair

PART 2 • MORE RHYMES

SAY “Listen closely to each tiny poem. I will read the words in the row. Which word rhymes with the word I ask about? Circle it.”

ROW	SAY	STUDENTS CIRCLE
a	Listen: “A fox naps in a box.” Here are the words: rain, box, leaf. Which word rhymes with fox?	box
b	Listen: “A bee flies by a tree.” Here are the words: tree, mouse, cloud. Which word rhymes with bee?	tree
c	Listen: “A bug sits on a rug.” Here are the words: sun, rug, fan. Which word rhymes with bug?	rug

WHAT TO ACCEPT

Accept circles on boat, trail, chair, box, tree, and rug, in order. Students may point to or say the rhyming word before circling it.
