COUNT EQUAL GROUPS

Multiplication helps you count equal groups quickly. Count how many groups there are, then count how many are in each group. You can also add the same number again and again.

WORKED EXAMPLE

There are 3 plates with 4 cookies on each plate. How many cookies are there?

1. There are 3 equal groups.
2. Add $4 + 4 + 4 = 12$.
3. Write 3 groups of 4 as $3 \times 4 = 12$.

Answer: 12 cookies
