SHOW A NUMBER THREE WAYS

A digit's place tells its value. In expanded form, add the value of each nonzero digit. In word form, name the thousands, hundreds, tens, and ones.

WORKED EXAMPLE

Write 6,482 in expanded form and word form.

1. Find the place values: 6,000, 400, 80, and 2.
2. Add the values: $6,000 + 400 + 80 + 2$.
3. Write the words: six thousand four hundred eighty-two.

Answer: $6,000 + 400 + 80 + 2$; six thousand four hundred eighty-two
